

A NEW HOME

As Val and I increasingly became aware that using the stairs in our house several times each day was becoming more difficult we made the decision in 2012 to sell our Woori Beach house (after 48 years ownership and 39 years permanent residency) and look for a suitable single-level house in Gerringong where we wanted to remain.

Being aware houses that would meet our requirements were not always available for sale at any particular time and there was no guarantee that our house would sell quickly, we prayed that God would ensure that the whole process would proceed with minimal hassles. The answer to prayer was far more remarkable than we could have imagined. Shortly before putting our house on the market in September 2012 our next door neighbour came in with a written offer which we accepted immediately. Even more extraordinary proof of God's hand in this was in the timing - on the previous night I had rung the daughter of Bevily Bheesman (whom we had known well before her death a few weeks earlier) and asked to let us know whether her family would be selling their late mother's house at 7 Boolangatta Avenue, Gerringong (3 streets west of Pacific Avenue). As they were intending to sell, we briefly looked at other houses but decided that 7 Boolangatta Avenue would be our home - hopefully for the rest of our lives. Shortly afterwards both contracts were signed - the sale of 43 Pacific Avenue and the purchase of 7 Boolangatta Avenue.

Sharing Memories. A week before we moved Val arranged for our whole family to join in a farewell dinner. With a mixture of joy and sadness each one of us shared a story of some memorable occasion in the house. While it was fun it was also a reminder, not so much of

the house but the joy we had experienced as a family over the years. We gave thanks to God for all those wonderful memories.

Another extraordinary part of this story is that three weeks later on a night that Aditi had a number of friends staying for a birthday sleepover in our new home mini-cyclones hit Wanni Beach and other nearby areas significantly damaging our former Pacific Avenue home. We can only imagine the injuries if the girls had been sleeping in the lounge room of that house - the room that sustained the most damage.

"We have settled well into our new home which is ideal for us at our stage of life. There are no stairs and the house is still large enough to entertain friends and for Debbie, grandchildren or visitors to stay overnight.

I also realise something of the emotional pressure my health issues placed on her, but her loving support never wavered.

We have been extraordinarily blessed

in being given four wonderful children. It has been a delight to see them growing into mature responsible adults. They have all contributed positively to their community and their various places of work. Three of them have married and become marvellous loving parents while Debbie is an extraordinary Auntie to our seven grandchildren who in turn think the world of her.

The further amazing blessing has been the gift of seven grandchildren and we have been able to see them developing with each demonstrating their individual personalities and abilities. Val and I constantly pray for God's blessing on their lives and that we will continue to be an influence for good in their lives, that particularly, as we live in a way that is pleasing to God, it may help them to want to know and serve Him.

As I come closer to the end of my life I recognise God's hand in every part of that life and I am encouraged to take St Paul's words and make them my own:
