The name Coolum means "blunt" or "headless" and is originally derived from the local Aboriginal word "gulum.".

This refers to the shape of Mount Coolum which is one of the largest rocks in the world, formed from magma pushing through the earth's crust:

Lit has no peak, but is instead a bulged mountain with a flat top.

#### What is the population of Coolum?

The population of Coolum is 8,49715,948 as of the 2016-2021 Australia Census.

#### Is Coolum Beach dog friendly?

Yes Yes, Coolum has a dog friendly section of beach.

Unfortunately Unfortunately, you can't bring you fury friend to the main beach of Coolum, but only a short walk away there is a 1km stretch of pet friendly sand and surf, just north of the Caravan park. This is what makes Coolum so popular for owners who bring their pets on holidays.

#### How long does it take to walk up Mount Coolum?

It takes 45 minutes to walk up Mount Coolum with the track being 600m or 1.68 km return. The elevation is Mount Coolum is 180m-208 m above sea level and it can be quite challenging for inexperienced hikers.

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The best time to climb Mount Coolum is <u>in the early hours of the</u> morning. This will allow you before sunrise to experience uninterrupted views of the sun rising across the ocean.

#### Can you drive up Mount Coolum?

No. You <u>can notcannot</u> drive up Mount Coolum. Mount Coolum is accessed via a 1.8km return walking track on the <u>e</u>East side of the mountain.

# **Mount Coolum**

Named after an Aboriginal warrior, Mount Coolum is a site to behold and must-see visit destination when visiiting the Sunshine Coast. Mount Coolum is situated within Mount Coolum National Park, and was formed 26 million years ago through volcanic activity. This activity causeding magma to

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bulge up through the earth's crust, forming the mountain we see today.

The peak sits at 20810 m and has panoramic views of the Sunshine Coast beaches; including Coolum, as well as the Glasshouse Mountains.

### **Climbing Mount Coolum**

There is a 1.6 km track that is fairly steep, starting at a carpark on Tanah Street in the suburb of Mount Cocolum Coolum. The track begiiins gentlye but quickly becomes steep and can be dangerous when wet, so make sure you are well prepared if planning to hike to the summit.

The walk should take roughly 1.5 hours return and should be tackled by reasonably fit people.

If you are an early riser, climbing Mount Coolum in the early hours to witness the sunrise will be one of the highlights of your trip to the region.
